However, for dinner, all of us detested the idea of heading over to Allison dining hall, and we were appalled by the lack of coupon offers on UberEats and DoorDash as well. Then, it hit one of my friends to order a pizza. As we compared the prices of Domino's and Papa Johns, it was the same friend who then directed our attention to the Perfect Combo Deal. Doing the math, if we split the food between the four of us, we would each only pay \$5.51 after tax while having enough food for dinner and even future leftovers.
